Dear Parents and Community Members,

During the 2014-16 school years, Seven Oak Middle School participated in our state required assessment, Smarter Balanced. Every two years the data is combined into a number of percentage met. This number is then placed on a scale from 1-5. In the 2014-16 school years Seven Oak scored a level 3 overall on the new Smarter Balanced test. This places right in the middle of the scale. In the last years of the OAKS (our prior assessment) Seven Oak had scored a level 4 overall.

Since the two tests (OAKS and SBAC) are very different in how they measure student performance, we are in the process of learning how to best instruct and support students in demonstrating their knowledge with this new assessment. We are seeking to regain our level 4 rating in the with in the next two years. To help our school achieve the goal of a level 4 rating we will continue to add more support options for students. In the 2016-17 school year, we have added more advanced course options, more core subject support opportunities and more elective options for our students! Through these programs and an focus on test taking strategies we will achieve our goals. For when students are

engaged in school, have support to meet new challenges, and know how to demonstrate that knowledge, they will find academic success.

We are proud to be in our 4th year of implementation of AVID at Seven Oak Middle School. AVID is a college readiness system that has been proven to increase rigor and achievement for all students. Through our work with the Common Core State Standards we promise to continue to deliver the same excellence you have come to expect from us.

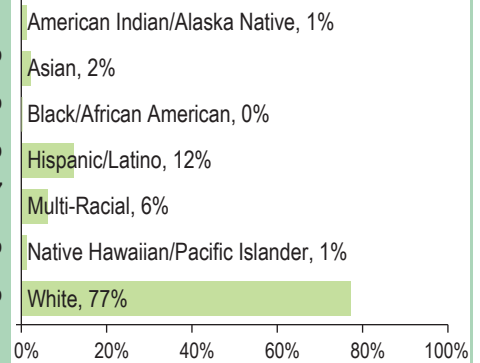

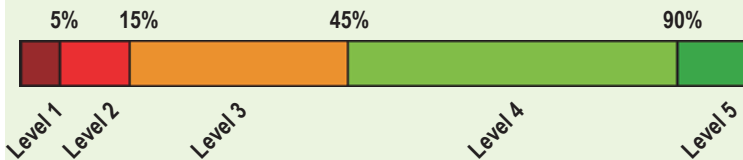
