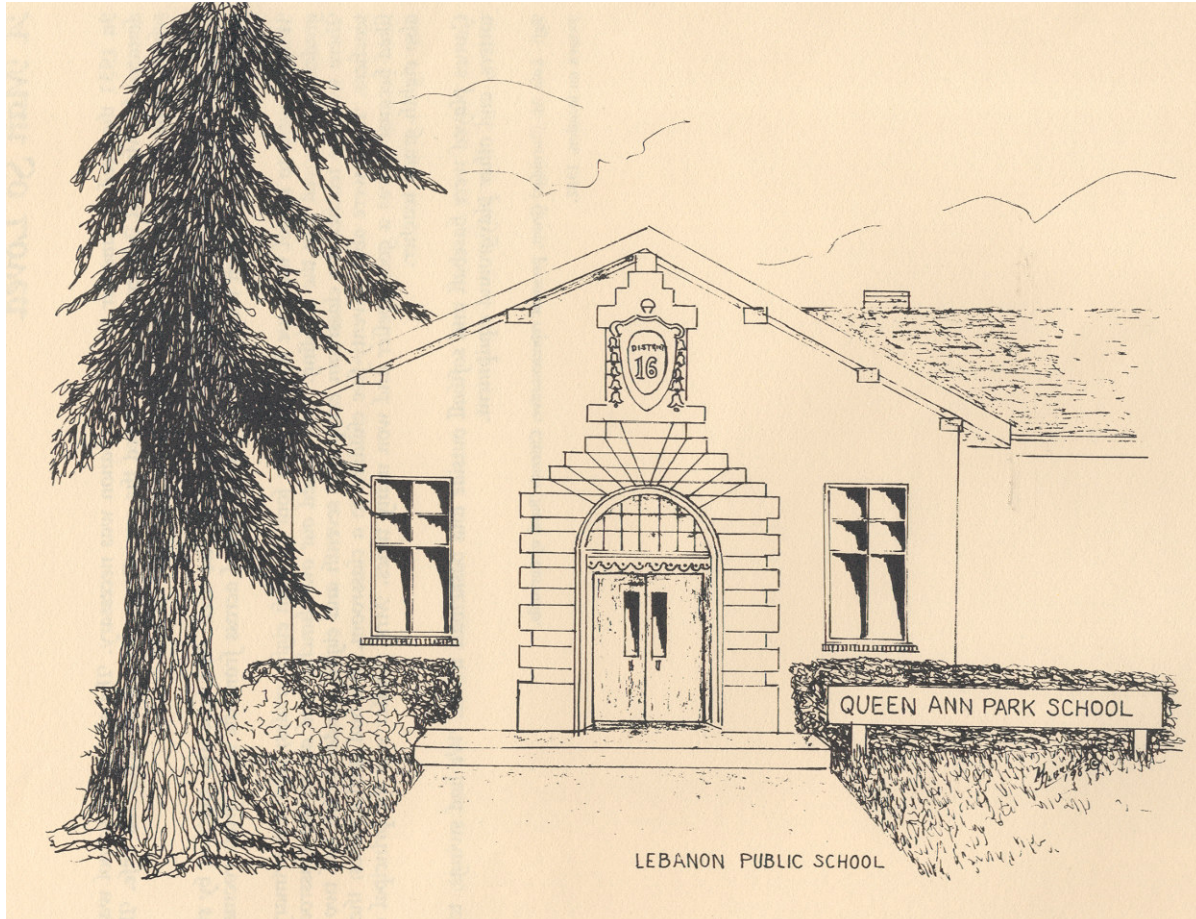


Queen Anne

A Man So Loved
From When the Bells Rang



In 1931 the need for another school in Lebanon was necessary. The site of the school was donated by Mr. Joel Mayer. He had named the area Queen Ann Park, after his wife. The school, quite naturally, was named the Queen Ann Park School.

This was an eight room building with a gym and office area. The heat was supplied by steam and radiators were in each room. The gym was located across from the sixth grade rooms.

When I went to school there we had only the four through eight grades; later the primary grades were moved into the building. We carried our own lunches and ate in our classrooms. There was one teacher per classroom except the seventh and eighth grades which had two teachers. There were about twenty-five children to a classroom. We had spelling bees; these I liked because I was a good speller and won many times. Mrs. Fauller was the principal and also eighth grade teacher.

Games played were baseball and softball outside and basketball inside. We had swings, teeter totters, and other playground equipment.
