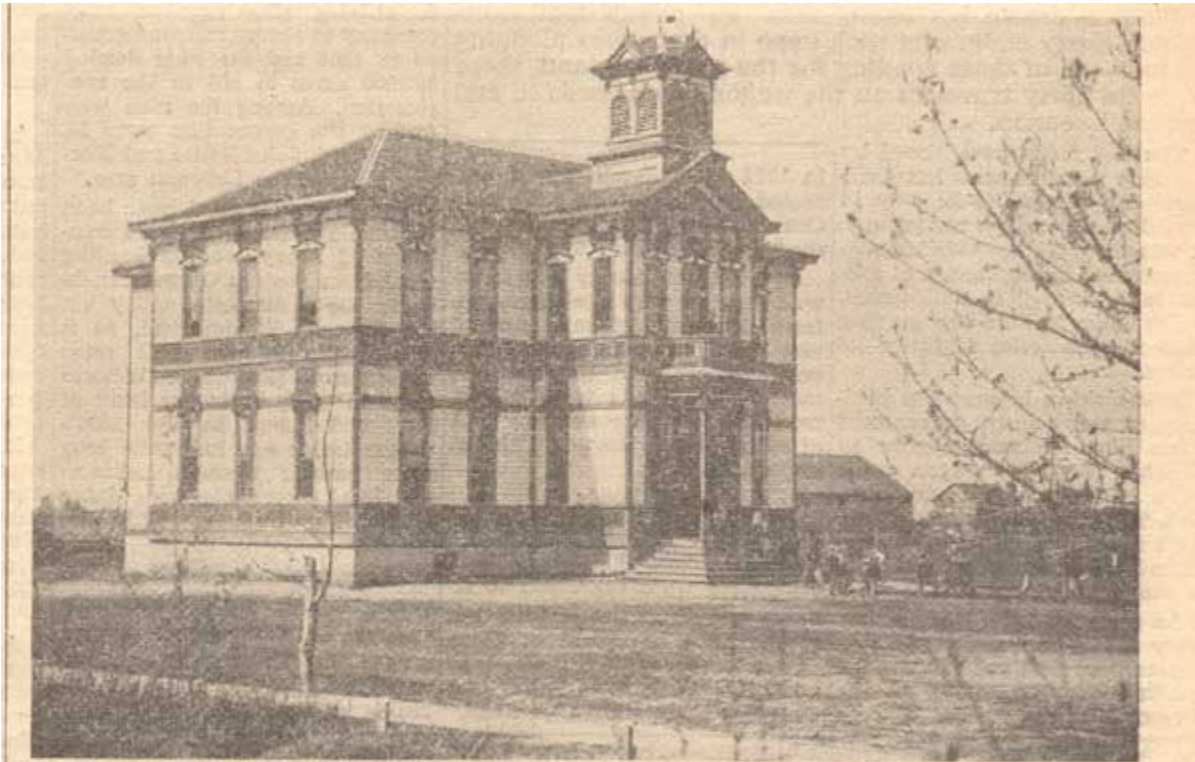


Second Street School



OLD SECOND STREET SCHOOL... This pretentious edifice was the pride of Lebanon at the turn of the century and housed the town's public school system for more than 30 years. Located on south Second street, it was built in 1891 and was razed in 1928 to make way for industrial operations. Of special interest are the fancy decorations on window casings, the wrought-iron roof establishments and the observation balcony above the front entrance.

Second Street What little information there is about the Second Street School (the second public school in Lebanon) comes primarily from two news clippings from the Lebanon Express . We also know, from Mary Jo Albright's writings, that the Second Street School, being a public school, offered significant competition to the Santiam Academy, which charged tuition.
